The idea of the H&P Foundation was birthed in recurrent discussions on how individuals in Africa who were born in underprivileged and impoverished backgrounds could escape the sometimes inevitable cycle of poverty. It is within this framework that we expressed our desire to give back to society. In these discussions, we realized how much education can change the trajectory of one's life, especially for those who have great academic potential but lack the opportunity and supportive environment to realize their potential.

Having been beneficiaries of scholarship programs that enabled us to acquire high-quality education in arguably some of the best schools in Kenya and the world, we crafted the idea of starting a foundation with the aim of changing the lives of marginalized children in Kenya through supporting their full education needs. But beyond just paying school fees and boarding needs of the students our vision is to expose as many children as possible to learning opportunities that would not be easily acquired within the walls of the current Kenyan classroom.

Driven by the desire to see change, we decided to start somewhere, and in 2021, we put up a call for applications for the first H&P Scholars, targeting students who had sat for the 2020 Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) national examination. Our call for applications received about 100 deserving applications in only 10 days, which was an indication that there was a huge gap and a need for scholarships. We were only able to fully support two students due to financial constraints, but this became the start of our journey to support many more in the years to come. We are extremely grateful to the friends who have supported us, especially in our infancy.

This financial outlook outlines the educational needs for our scholars in 2024, denominated in Kenyan Shillings (KES). The total amount of 576,000 KES is earmarked for the educational requirements of our current four scholars. However, we're excited to announce our intention to extend our support by seeking sponsors for two additional students in the upcoming year. In doing so, the total amount necessary to cover the basic educational needs will increase to 1,164,000 KES or approximately USD 10,000. Please note that this figure does not encompass additional activities such as computer classes and internships.

At present, we've achieved 1% of our 2024 fundraising goal. To meet our financial targets and ensure that all payments are made promptly, allowing us to shift our focus to enriching extra-curricular activities and fundraising for 2025, we need to raise the remaining \$10,000 by February 2024. While we've made significant progress at 1%, we hold strong confidence that, with your continued support, we can reach our 100% goal by February 2024. Together, we can make a substantial impact in the lives of these scholars.

Education Scholarships

Our education scholarships are a financial aid initiative designed to provide financial support to students pursuing their secondary school education. The financial support covers all the financial needs and requirements of the students for the duration of their secondary school education. This includes school fees, boarding needs (shopping each term for boarding necessities e.g soap), pocket money, school supplies, transport to and from school, cost of books, and costs of participation in extra-curricular activities where required. The primary goal of the education scholarship program is to meet all the financial needs related to education, thereby allowing them to focus on their schooling.

Education Advocacy

Our education advocacy program is dedicated to ensuring that students have equitable access to quality education by addressing disparities in educational access, resources, and outcomes. We do this through policy engagement, public awareness, legal advocacy and litigation, research and analysis, and administrative engagement. The primary goal of our education advocacy is to address inequalities the education system, advocate for positive changes in education, and promote equity and access.

Extra-curriculars

Our extra-curriculars program is geared at providing students with opportunities that would otherwise not be provided within the regular school setting.
